




#### Vision:

#### **Positive Solutions for Families**

#### **PSFF | 8 Sessions**

Teaches parents/families of all backgrounds:

- How ACEs may be impacting them as parents; builds their skills using a strengths approach
- Promotion of children's social-emotional skills
- How to understand children's challenging behavior
- Use of positive approaches to help children learn appropriate behavior



- Filling your child's bucket, building child's emotional vocabulary, choices, and detective skills
- Removing "no," "stop," and "don't" from vocabulary
- How to investigate, ask questions
- Rewording "no," "stop," and "don't" into more positive language
- Play time, respond calmly, consistency, prepping for potential upcoming bad behaviors
- Talking about our plans, family rules (gathered together), revisiting the breath techniques
- ACEs



## **Family Support & Education**

#### **Positive Solutions for Families**

#### Two additional sessions added:

- ACEs taught by trained
   Mental Health Specialists (TRE)
- Last session added on resiliency skills (this session was requested by parents)

#### **Training Success is attributed to:**

- Location/safe and trusted place for parents
- Develops an understanding of who they are: It's not "What's wrong with you," but rather "What happened to you?"
- Logistics build social capital
- Positive results from the training


# Colorado Early Learning & Development Guidelines

ELDGs build a 'hands on' understanding of child development and milestones for families.

- ➤ Training for 150 parents and early care and education professionals
  - Face to Face trainings through a video series:
     60 Participants received information on how to share ELDG information with families
- ➤ 100 parents introduced to ELDG videos at early care and education programs

## **Community Playgroups**

- ➤ Nurse Family Partnerships (WIC Office)
- > Catholic Charities
  - 96% of children interact more with others their age
  - 79% of adults socialize *more* with other parents/caregivers
  - 88% gained new knowledge of community resources & Early Language and Literacy
  - 63% gained new knowledge of children's social emotional behavior

Health & Well-Being

More than 1 in 10 Colorado children under 6 have already been **exposed** to two or more **ACEs**. Among all Colorado kids under 18, the number rises to 1 in 5.



## Pyramid Plus Project: Three-Year Results

- > 6 Sustaining Implementation Sites
- > 568 trained in Pyramid Plus Approach
- > 229 teachers coached for a year
- ➤ 69 (68%) teachers achieved fidelity to model (of 101 observed)
  - Supports their work in the inclusion of children with disabilities
  - Supports their work in promotion of children's social emotional competence
  - Supports their work in addressing challenging behavior
- > 14,807 children impacted
- > 6166 parents trained
- > 278 in Positive Solutions for Families





# **Early Childhood Mental Health Specialists**

- AFK, in partnership with The Resource Exchange, offers an Early Childhood Specialists referral line.
- Support is for teachers, directors and parents of children birth to eight who are showing disruptive behaviors in a care or home setting.
- Establish plan to implement behavior interventions or to improve social/emotional supports in classrooms.
